Both the cadet's and his/her parent's or guardian's signatures are required on this document for participation in the Program.

Participation in JROTC does not commit or obligate any student to military service. It does not guarantee special consideration if a student chooses to enter any service. However, a cadet who completes two or three years of JROTC may qualify for advanced rank upon enlistment in the military. Additionally, students who are enrolled in their senior year may be eligible to compete for ROTC scholarships.

Standards of Conduct

- Uniforms are issued free of charge; however, cadets will pay for any lost or damaged uniform items.
- Uniforms must be worn once each week on prescribed days and will be worn for that entire school day.
