

CRIMINAL JUSTICE OBJECTIVES

Distinguish the police role, the judicial system function, and the correctional techniques used in dealing with offenders.

Demonstrate an understanding of the differences between the crime-control model and the dueprocess model as it pertains to the criminal justice system.

Distinguish the historical antecedents of the American legal system

Distinguish between the FBI's UCR/NIBRS program and the NCVS and what they can tell us about crime in the United States today.

Recall and evaluate the major sources of crime and victimization data.

Discuss the crime trend for violent crime and property crime for the last 25 years.

List and explain the different kinds of law enforcement agencies and jurisdictions.

Discuss the role and function of law enforcement.

Recall the factors in society that contributed to the formation of the police.

Recognize critical issues in policing: effectiveness, discretion, racial profiling, corruption, brutality, and ethics.

Recognize major constitutional issues that involve policing: search and seizure and interrogation.

Identify and distinguish the impact of police subcultures.

Discuss and analyze how the Constitution and/or court precedent empowers or limits law enforcement behavior.

Describe and explain reasonable suspicion, probable cause, and elements of an arrest with/without a warrant.

Discuss and explain law enforcement rules

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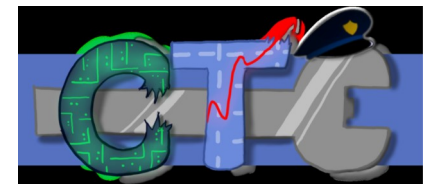
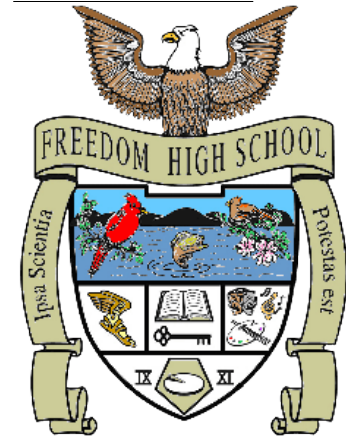
